Brave New World: How GPs are Using SBIC Leverage and How LPs View Capital

Allocations

The recent modernization of the SBIC program—especially the increase in leverage caps—is an inflection point for the market. Raising the standard cap to the lesser of 200% of private capital or \$250 million, along with higher common-control limits and new exclusions for critical technology and manufacturing investments, gives managers more room to scale and deploy capital efficiently. LPs see this as overwhelmingly positive: they see stronger fund economics, better alignment with national priorities, and a more competitive return profile compared to similar middle-market strategies. In short, the new caps make SBICs more attractive, not just as a policy tool, but as an institutional grade investment strategy. The new SBIC leverage caps materially strengthen the program’s value proposition.
